Premier's Citizenship Award

Each high school in Alberta can nominate one graduating grade 12 student to receive the Premier's Citizenship Award. Recipients will receive a letter of commendation from the Premier and will also be considered for further scholarships. Applicants must have displayed outstanding character in citizenship, leadership, community service and/or engagement in volunteer work, as well as having shown initiative, and having had a positive impact in their community or school.

Sponsored by: Alberta Scholarship Programs.

Purpose: In recognition of students graduating from high school who have supported and contributed to Alberta communities through public service and voluntary endeavours.

Eligibility: Applicants must be a Canadian Citizen, permanent resident, or protected person. A nominee must be an Alberta resident in their graduating year.

Selection: Recipients are selected by a selection committee set up at each school. Selection is based on leadership, citizenship, community service activities or volunteer work. Academic achievement may be considered once candidates have met the eligibility criteria.

Recipients of the Premier's Citizenship Award are also eligible to be considered for:

- the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Citizenship Medallion, which provides a medal, \$7,000 and a letter of commendation from the Lieutenant Governor, and
- the Alberta Centennial Scholarship in the amount of \$2,005.

Recipients for these two awards are selected from the pool of students who received a Premier's Citizenship Award.

- **Citizenship** As demonstrated through involvement in the political process, e.g. student government, municipal, provincial or federal level.
- Leadership Led or started various activities, influenced others, and/or made improvements/changes.
- Community Service and Volunteer Engagement Activities participated in, not mandated by the student's program of study or courses.

The Record of Accom	plishments is evaluated	according to the following criteria:

Grade	The Grade the student was in when participating in the activity or project.	
Activity	Briefly describe the activity or project.	
Role	Student's role, e.g. volunteer, participant, leader, coach, president, initiator, organizer, founder, etc.	
	What was accomplished? Did the student develop skills? Did their participation make a difference? Would the activity/project have taken place without them? Will the activity/project continue after the candidate has left high school?	
Time Volunteered	Estimate total number of hours devoted to the activity/project. Examples: If student tutored 1 hour/week for the entire school year, write 30 hours (average 3 weeks/ month x 10 months). If student worked 5 days at an activity for 12 hours each day, write 60 hours.	

Submission:

Submit the nomination form, Record of Accomplishments Chart and supporting reference letters to your high school. Your school will submit the application package to Alberta Arts, Culture and Status of Women as part of the nomination process.

The nomination is then forwarded to the Alberta Citizenship Awards Selection Committee.

For each Grade Level, complete the candidate's record of accomplishments according to the following format (in three pages or less). Please avoid using acronyms as much as possible.

Note: The completed chart must be verified by initialing each page and signed by one of the references, a school principal or school counsellor.
