## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

What a wonderful Winter Break we had (notwithstanding a bit of a temperature drop) - and our staff was able to attend some wonderful sessions for professional development at this year's Teacher's Convention on February 24 & 25th. We now take some of that learning and see how we can implement new techniques and strategies to help and support our students.

The days are stretching longer and there is a warmth in the air. Spring is on it's way! Please ensure your child has appropriate clothing for our changing weather conditions and the playground that will soon become a small lake as it Monday, March 14 melts! Winter boots are still needed now, but soon, they will require rubber boots as the field warms up, melts and becomes a mushy wet mess. It might be Wednesday, March 16 a good idea to throw in an extra pair of socks or two into their backpack as there are definitely wet feet happening!

Our Reading Challenge was a hit! We had 252 students complete week one, which means OP students read a MINIMUM of 37,380 minutes or 623 hours in the first week of the Reading Challenge - and then every week since then, means they read: 186,900 minutes or 3,115 hours - on top of what they read in school every day!!! This is amaaaaaazing (spelling error intentional for emphasis!!) and certainly good for our Literacy goal. We will wrap up our prizes for the Reading Challenge this week and end with a school-wide celebration of a hot dog (regular or halal), a juice box & a cookie for every student! Way to go Orioles!!!!

The Learning Loss Intervention Program (LLIP) is well underway with our students in Grades 2 & 3 and beginning on March 7th, our Grade 1's will begin their LLIP program. We know that Grades 1-3 are considered foundational years in developing reading & math skills and with the disruption in learning caused by the pandemic the Alberta Government has provided one-time

funding targeted for students in grades one to three. OP has adjusted and hired additional staff to help students who require additional support in Literacy &/or Numeracy in their foundational year. This support will continue until early June at which point, students will be reassessed to measure growth & improvement. We continue to offer all our other classroom supports that were in place as well - the LLIP is additional support.

March brings our 3rd school term to a close and with that comes a reporting period. Teachers are busy in the classroom finishing various units of instruction and will report on your child's progress in each of their subject areas. Note the dates in the calendar and book a time for a Parent-Teacher Interview. Our hope, if nothing changes between now and March 17, is that we can offer a hybrid model of interviews for parents to choose from. If it is more convenient for you to do a Google Meet or a phone call, we can accommodate that. We believe that we can also return to in-person interviews - booked in advance on schoolinterviews.ca if that is a better fit for your needs. More information will follow as we get closer to the dates of interviews (March 16 & 17).

#### **ASSURANCE SURVEY**


# Every year, the Government of Alberta puts out a survey to students, and parents of in targeted grades. This year, they are seeking input from students in Grades 4, 7, and 10 and from the respective parents as well. All staff in every school are also expected to have input on the survey. This is called the Alberta Assurance Survey and provides an opportunity for feedback on how schools & the education system in Alberta is doing according to their stakeholders.

Our grade 4 students at OP will be completing the survey the week of March 1 - 4 in class with their homeroom teacher (online). Parents receive information directly from Alberta Education and will receive instructions on how to complete the survey from Alberta Ed. If you require any assistance, please let us know at the school and we would be happy to assist in any way we can. Remember, this is ONLY for the parents of students in Grade 4.

### **COVID - Step 2**

With the recent government announcement regarding Step 2 changes in COVID-19 restrictions, note that schools are still engaging in enhanced cleaning and sanitization procedures. Although mask restrictions are lifted, staff AND students still have the option to wear a mask as they see fit or as parents request. All persons who make the decision to wear or not wear a mask will be treated with respect.

We are going to approach this next stage with caution and care and not make whole-scale changes to ensure the safety of our students and staff. Although we welcome the move to more normal operations and having our parents and OP Community an integral part of our school fabric, we also recognize that this is not comfortable for all to move to a full open system yet. We will do everything we can to ensure the safety of our students, staff, and greater community while operating within the new Government guidelines. # AHS ROUTINE VACCINATIONS

As per protocols that have been arranged between School Divisions and AHS for dozens of years, we will have AHS Community Health Nurses at OP School in late March for routine Grade 1 Immunization for either/both of Measles, Mumps, Rubella & Varicella or Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis and Polio.

Consent forms and further information have been sent home ONLY to those students who AHS deems is eligible for their vaccination. Consent forms MUST BE SIGNED by parent and returned to the school. No vaccinations will occur without parental consent. NO

COVID-19 vaccinations have or will occur in schools.


