





### **Opportunities and Challenges:**

Adding the Student Support Room to the Learning Support Team is an opportunity to meet the needs of more students social/emotional needs while still maintaining connection to the school and classroom. The intent is that more students are able to access short term regulatory strategies to be able to return to class activities, rather than having to be removed from the classroom environment for larger dysregulated episodes. The new ELAL and Math 6 curriculum implementation brings some uncertainty, as all new curriculum will. There has not been direction as far as what the PAT may look like and this provides a challenge for teachers when planning and supporting students. A strong teaching and support staff ensures students receive high quality instruction and support in all areas of learning.

### A Year of Success:

Red Deer Public Schools continues to provide high quality learning opportunities for our students. #### **Anecdotal Results:**

• This year shows tremendous growth in the perception of parents, students and teachers where equity is concerned in our building.

#### **Analysis:**

- The parent results show the most dramatic increase. This may be because of an increased effort to engage parents across the district and within our building.
- As we continue to move further away from the COVId pandemic, I think results will continue to improve. Parents were
  isolated and felt disconnected, whereas there are now more opportunities for parents to be more directly involved in their
  child's learning opportunities

#### Action:

- This past year we have been purposeful in reaching out to parents for feedback on grade scales and preferences
- Weekly parent update sent home to inform parents of what is happening at school
- Continue the supports offered in the Student Support Room
- Continue the Advisory/House system for all students to be connected to an adult in the building
- Positive postcards sent home to students from staff
